

Supporting the Next Generation of AEC Professionals

Our scholarship initiative plays a crucial role in keeping students engaged and excited about the opportunities within the AEC industry. By providing financial support, we aim to inspire the next generation of architects, engineers, and construction professionals to pursue their passions and contribute to the industry's growth and innovation.

Since 2020, PWC Boston has awarded **\$144,000 in scholarship funds**. In the 2024-2025 chapter year, we awarded a total of **\$56,000** in scholarships, nearly \$16,000 more than the year before. 


